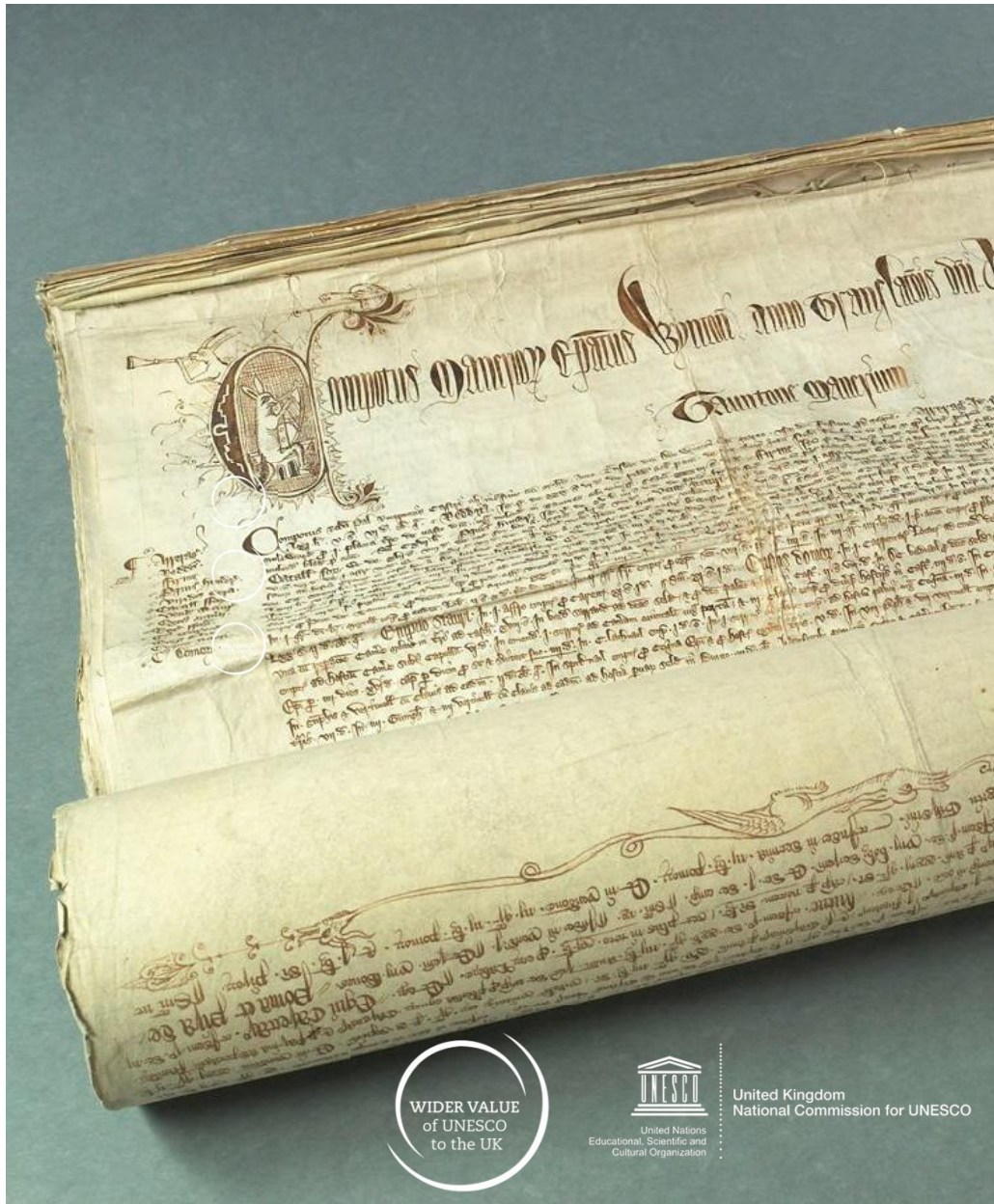

ANY PERSON desirous of joining the Party may obtain a Ticket of the Master, Mr. GAGE, of the Teachers, or through any of the Scholars, but SIXPENCE EXTRA WILL BE CHARGED ON THE MORNING OF THE EXCURSION.

Parties of not less than Eight Persons can have a compartment reserved for their special use, both going and returning, by applying for the same not later than 8 o'clock on the previous evening.

BOURNEMOUTH is a very pretty watering place in the south-west corner of the county. The town has increased rapidly and contains numerous capacious and elegant mansions and villas, and is much frequented on account of its mild and genial atmosphere, its facilities for bathing, the beautiful scenery in its neighbourhood, and the equable nature of its climate all the year round. The splendid scenery of hill and dale, studded with well-built residences form a picturesque view; the terraces, slopes, and roads are irregularly laid out. Sir James Clark and Drs. Aitkin and Granville strongly recommend this favoured spot for preserving the health and strengthening the constitution that is impaired.

ARRANGEMENTS.

The Children will meet on the Station Hill at 7.30 o'clock a.m., and proceed to the Railway Station, from whence the Party will start by Special Train at 7.50 punctually, and proceed via Bishopstoke, Southampton West, and Ringwood, (passing on their way through the heart of the New Forest) direct to Bournemouth, which they will reach at about 10 o'clock. From 8 to 9 hours will then be spent—no doubt pleasantly—in various amusements on the Beach, and in visiting the places of interest in Bournemouth. Adult Friends will have the opportunity of going to Poole or Swanage, or of having a pleasant ride round the Bay in the Steamers which ply at frequent intervals at cheap rates. At 4 o'clock the Scholars will be supplied with tea; and after resuming their amusements for a short time, will return to the Railway Station. The Train will start at 6.50 punctually, and return by the same route to Basingstoke, which will be reached by about 9.10. The Mechanics' Institute Band have kindly promised to meet the party at the Station and play them into town.

Children not belonging to the School will be allowed to join the Party only upon condition that they keep with the School and attend to all orders given, UNLESS THEY ARE ACCOMPANIED BY THEIR PARENTS, OR SOME ONE CAPABLE OF TAKING CARE OF THEM.

Bathing and Boating will on no account be allowed to those holding Childrens' Tickets, except when Parents take the responsibility, notice of which should be given to Mr. Gage.

Every possible arrangement has been made to ensure the safety and comfort of the children and Party generally, so that the promoters of the above Excursion can confidently recommend it on this account.

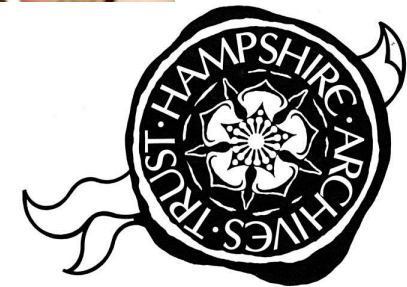

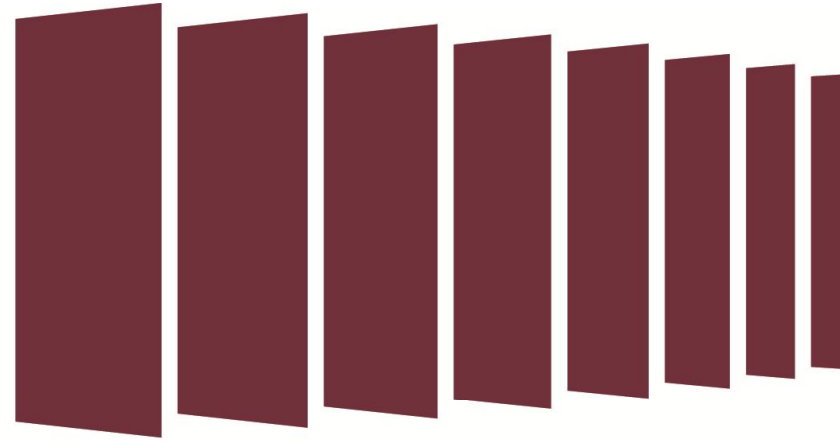
