1. The decision:

1.1. That an Order to divert part of Shedfield Footpath No. 11, made under Section 119 Highways Act is made by Countryside Access Group Manager.

2. Reason(s) for the decision:

- 2.1. Officers consider that it is expedient to divert this footpath in the interests of the landowner. The proposed alignment of the diversion is not considered to be substantially less convenient to the public than the existing route.
- 2.2. The current footpath runs access arable field to a stile at the parish boundary.
- 2.3. The proposed route will be between field boundaries, along grass track 1.1 metres apart, widening to 2.5 metres apart after a distance of 5 metres, which is post and rail fenced on both sides. The proposed route is 50 metres south-easterly of the existing route (at the widest point) and will 179 metres long.
