1. The decision:

- 1.1. That the Executive Lead Member for Adult Social Care and Public Health approves the grant funding for one-off works of up to a maximum amount of £100,268 to be awarded to Midlands Partnership NHS Foundation Trust as detailed in this report.
- 1.2. That the Executive Lead Member for Adult Social Care and Public Health delegates authority to the Director of Public Health to finalise the proposals for works and the amount of the grant up to the maximum approved.

2. Reasons for the decision:

- 2.1. In 2021/22 funding was made available nationally by Office for Health Improvement & Disparities (OHID) to all local authorities to increase the capacity of inpatient medically managed detoxification Services. The Central South Coast Consortium (comprising of 20 local authorities) was established with Hampshire as the lead authority. Funding from the consortium was pooled to open a new detoxification unit in Hampshire.
- 2.2. The government has allocated additional funding to all local authorities in England to increase the capacity of inpatient medically managed drug / alcohol detoxification.
- 2.3. Additional grant funding of up to £100,268 will be awarded to Midlands Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, who is the provider of inpatient detoxification services on behalf of the Central South Coast Consortium.
- 2.4. The funding must be spent in this financial year (before the end of March 2023). All spend must be accounted for by the provider and evidenced in the provider's ledger. Any underspend or expenditure which cannot be accounted for will be transferred back to OHID. The grant funding will only be spent on one-off works (deemed to be capital by the Provider).

i) To award grants totalling £86,654 to cover a range of time periods between February 2023 and July 2024 as part of the Local Solutions Fund (as detailed in appendix A).

2. Reasons for the Decision

- 2.1 The Voluntary Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) Sector contributes to improving people's quality of life. The grants programme is one of the ways in which the County Council supports the sector to support people to live fuller more independent lives.
- 2.2 The decision supports the aim of the Demand Management and Prevention Programme to reduce, delay and/or divert demand on Adults' Health and Care by supporting individuals on the cusp of care and their unpaid carers within their local communities in Hampshire so that they are able to lead healthy, happy, independent lives for as long as possible.

3. Other options considered and rejected:

3.1 Not to offer and award the grants contained within the report. This option was rejected because the grants programme is currently one of the ways in which the County Council supports the sector to support people to live fuller more independent lives and to reduce the demand for County Council services. Following the decision taken in June 2022 to cease three of the Adults' Health and Care grant schemes, the Local Solutions Fund is currently one of the

mitigating factors identified to provide support to VCSE organisations offering activities to prevent demand on adult social care.
