1. The decision:

- 1.1 That the Executive Lead Member for Universal Services approves the Project Appraisal for the A3057 Nursling and Rownhams Junctions Improvements, as outlined in the supporting report.
- 1.2 That approval be given to procure, spend and enter into the necessary contractual arrangements, in consultation with the Assistant Director of Legal Services and Monitoring Officer, to implement the proposed improvements at an estimated cost of £2.9million to be funded from local development contributions.
- 1.3 That authority to make the arrangements to implement the scheme, including minor variations to the design and contract, be delegated to the Director of Universal Services.
- 1.4 That the Executive Lead Member for Universal Services delegates authority to the Director of Universal Services, in consultation with the Assistant Director of Legal Services and Monitoring Officer, to progress any orders, notices or statutory procedures and secure any consents, licences, permissions, rights or easements necessary to enable implementation of the scheme

2. Reasons for the decision:

2.1 Capacity improvements to the A3057/Redbridge Lane junction are required to comply with the obligations of the Section 106 agreement following housing developments at Fen Meadows and previously agricultural land at The Stedding and Holly Winds on Rownhams Lane. Improvements to A3057/Horns Drove junction will complement the changes to the A3057/Redbridge Lane junction and ensure improved efficiency by linking

- the traffic signals to coordinate the flow of traffic between both A3057 junctions.
- 2.2 The scheme will alter and improve the junctions to provide better management of traffic through intelligent traffic signal control, enhanced dedicated crossing facilities for pedestrians and cyclists, provision for bus priority, and improved journey time reliability.

3. Other options considered and rejected:

- 3.1 Do nothing. This option was rejected as it would fail to address the planning obligations for making improvements to the A3057/Redbridge Lane junction.
- 3.2 Provide a full-size roundabout. This option was discounted as the footprint required to construct the roundabout exceeds the land available for the scheme. The option also requires the costly diversion of a large number of utility services, and would have a notable environmental impact.
- 3.3 Provide a mini roundabout. This option was discounted as it provided little benefit to traffic, pedestrian and cyclists, requires additional land and a costly diversion of utility services, and would have a notable environmental impact.

1. The decision:

- 1.1. That the Executive Lead Member for Universal Services approves a revised approach to concessionary fares reimbursement for local bus operators from 1 April 2023 until 31 March 2024, where reimbursement levels are based on the percentage of pre-COVID bus network that operators provide.
- 1.2. That the Executive Lead Member for Universal Services approves that up to £1.2 million per annum in 2022/23 and 2023/4 of the expected concessionary fares underspend be ringfenced to be used to support local bus services and related infrastructure in Hampshire.
- 1.3. That the Executive Lead Member for Universal Services delegates authority to the Director of Universal Services, in consultation with the Executive Lead Member of Universal Services and the Assistant Director for Legal Services and Monitoring Officer to determine the specific mechanisms through which the ringfenced sums are allocated to support local bus services and related infrastructure in Hampshire, based on the principles outlined in this report.

2. Reasons for the decision:

- 2.1. It is proposed that the County Council provide a higher level of concessionary fares reimbursement to the operators of bus services in order to support the industry whilst it navigates through an unprecedented period of rising costs, staff shortages and slow patronage growth by concessionary pass holders.
- 2.2. This approach has been the one adopted by the Council for the last two financial years and is recommended by the Department for Transport (DfT).
- 2.3. Ringfencing any underspend further achieves the aims set out in 2.1 as well as helping the Council achieve some of its National Bus Strategy ambitions of patronage growth as set out in its Bus Service Improvement Plan.

3. Other options considered and rejected:

- 3.1. To reimburse operators based on the actual number of passengers travelling. This option has been rejected as it would remove several million pounds from the bus industry in Hampshire which in turn would result in further service reductions.
- 3.2. Not to ringfence any underspend. This option has been rejected as it would not be consistent with the government objectives as set out in the DfT guidance issued in November 2022.
- 3.3. To use any underspend to meet other ongoing cost pressures. This option was rejected because the underspend is not expected to last into future years, with patronage from concessionary pass holders currently growing.

1. The decision:

1.1 That the Executive Lead Member for Universal Services gives authority to procure, spend and enter into any necessary contractual arrangements in consultation with the Assistant Director for Legal Services and Monitoring Officer for a new contract for the 49 service, as set out in the supporting report, to commence from 3 April 2023 for a period of 4 years, with the option to extend for a further two years, at an annual maximum cost of £153,200.

2. Reason for the decision:

2.1. Following Xelabus giving notice on the X9/X10 service between Waltham Chase/Bishops Waltham and Hedge End, residents from these areas currently have no public transport option for getting to Hedge End. Those who are eligible can use Eastleigh Dial-a-Ride, but this does not cater for all. Providing this vital link will allow the community to travel to Hedge End and connect with other commercial bus services to do necessary shopping, banking, and improve access to health, etc.

3. Other options considered and rejected:

- 3.1. Not to tender for a replacement bus service. This option was rejected due to the demand for the bus service, as demonstrated by the usage on the existing service, and the budget is currently available to provide this service.
- 3.2. To replace this service with a community transport alternative. Existing usage suggests that demand would exceed the available capacity on a community transport vehicle.
