Hampshire County Council Regulation 11 (Urgency) Notice of a Key Decision on 8 February 2021

Regulation 11 (special urgency) allows for a key decision to be made if it is impracticable for notice of the intention to take a key decision under Regulation 9 to be given 28 clear days in advance of the taking of the decision. This also allows for a Key Decision to be taken where it is impractical for public notice at least five working days before the decision is taken to be given in accordance with Regulation 10. Regulation 11 sets out the actions required to be taken in those circumstances which include gaining the consent of the Chairman of the relevant Select Committee or in their absence, of the Chairman of the County Council. A quarterly report of the Leader detailing Key Decisions taken under Regulation 11 is presented to the County Council.

This is an urgent key decision to enable progress with the proposal to set up asymptomatic testing sites in Hampshire, targeted to those people who need to leave home to go to work during this period of national restrictions. In accordance with Regulation 11, agreement has been obtained from the Chairman of the Health and Adult Social Care Select Committee, that the Key Decision is urgent and cannot reasonably be deferred.
