The Hampshire (New Forest) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2021 Burgate Fields Northern Spur Road and Burgate Fields from its junction with C148 Salisbury Road and a point 56 metres west:

- (i) No Waiting Monday to Friday 11 am to 11.30 am
- (ii) No stopping on school entrance markings Monday to Friday 8am to 5pm

2. Reason for the decision:

2.1. The northern spur road of Burgate Fields in Fordingbridge currently leads to The Burgate School and Sixth Form Centre. A proposed new development of Burgate Acres on land to the north of the school is to comprise of 63 dwellings including; estate roads, footpaths, open space and a new access road from A338 Salisbury Road to the new development. Burgate Fields northern spur road will have a new one-way highway link to the new access road. We are therefore responding to a request by the developer through their infrastructure consultants Bellamy

- Roberts to amend the existing restrictions to meet condition(s) when planning consent was granted.
- 2.2. No objections or representations were received in response to the public consultation which took place between 21st October 2022 and 11th November 2022.
- 2.3. Due consideration has been given to RTRA 1984 sections 122(1) and 122(2) and any other relevant legislation. In this case the Decision Maker acting on behalf of the Local Authority considers this TRO expeditious, for the convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians) and (where relevant) for the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off.
