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| Title: | Creation Order to record public footpath rights in the Parish of Colden Common |

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1. The decision:

- 1.1 That the authority is given for a Creation Order, under Section 26 of the Highways Act 1980, to record public rights on a route at a junction with Highbridge Road, running parallel to Kiln Lane in Colden Common.
- **1.2** A plan showing the route of this proposal is attached.

2. Reason(s) for the decision:

- 2.1 The Creation Order is required to record footpath rights over a route created as part of a planning application (06/02412/FUL).
- 2.2 The Order will formalise the public's right to use the route and ensure that the route becomes a highway maintainable at public expense.

Legal framework for the decision

Section 26 Highways Act 1980

Compulsory powers for creation of footpaths [bridleways and restricted byways]. (1) Where it appears to a local authority...that there is need for a footpath [bridleway or restricted byway] over land in their area and they are satisfied that, having regard to—

(a)the extent to which the path or way would add to the convenience or enjoyment of a substantial section of the public, or to the convenience of persons resident in the area, and

(b)the effect which the creation of the path or way would have on the rights of persons interested in the land, account being taken of the provisions as to compensation contained in section 28 below, it is expedient that the path or way should be created, the authority...may by order...create a footpath [bridleway or restricted byway] over the land.

3. Background

- **3.1** The hoggin path subject to this proposal was put in place following the condition of a planning application and has been in situ and used by the public for a significant period of time.
- 3.2 Hampshire County Council proposes to make an order now, as the legal process to formally dedicate the route was not carried out at the time the route was physically constructed and it is considered that progressing under Section 26 will resolve this matter more efficiently than seeking to enter into a voluntary agreement at this stage.
