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#### Purpose of this Report

1. The purpose of this report is to set out the current status of action that is underway by the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Integrated Care Board to tackle the ongoing challenges in relation to ensuring access to autism assessments in Hampshire.

#### Recommendation

2. That the Children and Young People Select Committee note the progress made and ongoing issues outlined in the update report.

#### **Executive Summary**

- 3. There are just over 20,000 people waiting for an Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC)/Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder assessment across the Hampshire and Isle of Wight geographical footprint.
- 4. In Hampshire there are 4,242 children and young people waiting for an Autism Assessment.
- 5. The current average diagnostic rate (prior to screening) for children and young people in Hampshire is 70.6%. This equates to 0.9% of the total population in Hampshire which is slightly under the nationally reported average of 1%.

#### **Transformation Plan and Progress**

6. Aim: By 2026: Establish a co-designed, all age transformed pathway model to meet ongoing demand for ADHD and Autism Spectrum condition. The model will be needs led, inclusive and will offer support, assessment and

guidance as appropriate as well as meet aspirations of the national and South-East Region Autism Strategy. Workstreams to run concurrently.
