

The Independent Custody visiting scheme Annual Seminar was attended by 40 volunteer visitors. Expert speakers gave presentations about topical issues including; Mental Health, Women in Custody, Liaison and Diversion. Chief Inspector Jim Pegler (Force Custody lead) gave an overview of the issues and challenges that are faced in today's policing. The group had a tour around the command and control centre and a demonstration of restraint and control techniques used in custody.


UNIVERSITIES - HATE CRIME
