

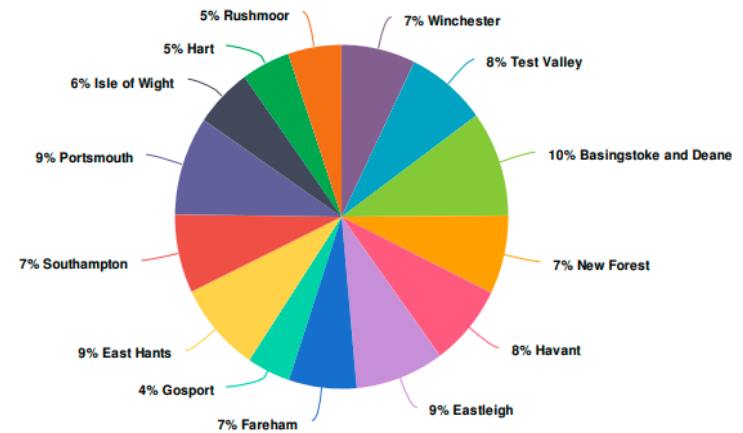


Police and Crime Plan Consultation Feedback and Review

- 7,336 responses and engagement with the Plan consultation
- 4,641 online survey responses
- Strong agreement for all nine priorities
- Tackling ASB and increased police visibility top priorities overall
- Media reach of 941,535
- Social media reach of 91,790
- 7 focus groups over 5 days



- Survey open for 8 weeks
- Wide consultation and engagement (Online survey, 7 focus group, YouGov representative survey, downloads and review of full plan)
- Feedback collated and analysed
- Report developed merging engagement, consultation and feedback received
