1. The decision:

- 1.1. That three notices be published in relation to variations to the on-street and off-street parking charges in Gosport, Test Valley and Winchester as follows:

2. Reason(s) for the decision:

- 2.1. On-street parking is the responsibility of the County Council in its role as the Highway Authority. In Test Valley and Gosport districts Hampshire County Council is solely responsible for on-street parking. The administration and enforcement of 'on-street' resident parking permit schemes need to run on a full cost recovery basis. This would mean that those residents who are not part of any resident's scheme would not have to subsidise the cost of resident parking as the scheme would be run on a cost neutral basis, with enforcement and other associated costs being funded by permit charges. Previously some District Councils operated residents' schemes at a deficit, this was clearly unsustainable and against the aims of a resident's permit parking scheme. The increase in fees brings these districts to the minimum charge for residential parking permits across the County.

Durrgate car park

The variation to charges at Durrgate car park, will ensure the car park in line with similar located car parks in Winchester that charge £2 on Sundays.

The introduction of season tickets will allow frequent users to utilise a discounted rate for parking, as well as aligning the car park with similar located car parks who offer the same method parking session
